

Equine Extension Specialist and Assistant Professor

Department of Animal Science Division of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources Oklahoma State University

Position Description: The Department of Animal Science at Oklahoma State University is seeking applicants for an 11-month, tenure-track position (80% extension, 20% teaching) which carries the expectation for excellence in extension, teaching, advising, scholarship, and grantsmanship commensurate with the land grant mission at Oklahoma State University. Primary job responsibilities will include equine programming leadership for the Oklahoma Cooperative Extension Service that will serve an array of clientele interests and activities as well as resident instruction in equine courses in the Department of Animal Science. Extension activities may include: providing research-based information and training to horse owners and organizations to support the horse-owning public and related agricultural businesses; organization and support of county, area, and district Extension staff; support programs for 4-H and other youth equine activities; service to horse industry organizations; and support of other departmental activities appropriate to the position, including contribution to scholarship, grantsmanship, and sponsorship. This position will serve as a resource for applied research efforts at OSU related to equine production and management.

Qualifications: Requirements include: a Ph.D. in Animal Science, Equine Science, or other terminal degree in a related field, with demonstrated ability and desire to contribute to extension, teaching, and scholarship. Preference will be given to individuals with good oral and written communication skills, good interpersonal skills, teaching excellence, successful teamwork, equine youth experience, and experience obtaining extramural funding for extension, teaching, and/or scholarship. Strong emphasis will be placed on ability to collaborate effectively with colleagues in the Department and Division, District, Area, and County Cooperative Extension Personnel, and potential to contribute to interdisciplinary Initiative teams.

Academic Rank: Assistant Professor

Salary: Competitive and commensurate with education and experience.

Application Deadline: Applications will be reviewed beginning February 15, 2014, and will continue until a suitable candidate is identified.

Date Position is Available: April 1, 2014, or as an outstanding candidate is available. Continuation of this position is subject to performance and need.
